
International Visegrad Fund = support of V4 cooperation

- the Fund as the concrete means of the cooperation
- support of movement of people and ideas
- instrument of **V4 foreign policy**

Basic Facts about the Fund:


- the only organization of the Visegrad Group
- to date the Fund has supported about 3,000 grant projects,
 1,000 scholarships and over
 100 artist residencies
- annual budget: €6,000,000
 (i.e. €1.5 million per V4 country)


2011 Budget Breakdown

Visegrad Scholarship Program

2011 Budget: **€1,448,000**

380 semesters

Deadline: 31 January

- Master's and Post-Master's levels
- Study/research periods for 1 or 2 semesters (Except for the Master's level within the *In-Coming* scheme in which it is possible to apply for 1- to 4-semester scholarships.)
- Financial support for both scholars and host universities + possibility of **travel grants** (Scholarships: €2,300/sem./scholar, €1,500/sem./host university.)
- Applications evaluated by independent experts from V4 countries

Types of Scholarships:

OUT-GOING SCHOLARSHIPS

(V4 scholars studying in AL, AM, AZ, BA, BY, GE, HR, MD, MK, ME, RS and UA; the same rules are applicable to **Kosovar universities**)

INTRA-VISEGRAD SCHOLARSHIPS

(V4 scholars studying at V4 universities)

IN-COMING SCHOLARSHIPS

(scholars from AL, AM, AZ, BA, GE, HR, MD, MK, ME, RU and RS to study at V4 universities; the same rules are applicable to **Kosovar scholars**)

Ukrainian Scholarships

(60 semesters annually for scholars from Ukraine to study at V4 universities)

Belarusian Scholarships

(60 semesters annually for scholars from Belarus to study at V4 universities)

Visegrad Scholarships at OSA

Launched in 2010 as a joint project between the Fund and the OSA Archivum Budapest (Open Society Archives)

- 10 fellowships annually (8 x V4, 2 x non-V4)
- max. research periods of 2 months
- €2,000/project
- no regular deadline (continuous submissions)

Visegrad University Studies Grant

2011 Budget: **€280,000**

Deadline: 10 November

- Grant for the development and launching of outstanding Visegrad-related university courses or degree programs
- Lump-sum, one-time support (€15,000/course, €50,000/degree program)

Supported Fields of Project Activities*

- Cultural Cooperation (ca. 50%)
- Scientific Exchange and Research (ca. 18%)
- Education (ca. 13%)
- Youth Exchanges (ca. 11%)
- Cross-Border Cooperation (ca. 6%)
- Promotion of Tourism (ca. 2%)
- * Every project should be recognizable in one of the *fields* but can in fact fall in any category of activity (e.g. *environment*, *sports* and *leisure*, *social affairs*, *publishing*, etc.).

Grant eligibility

- having a project with Visegrad feature
- not directly funded from state budget (main recipients: NGOs, municipalities, schools, private companies, individual citizens, etc.)
- involvement of **project partners** from at least **3 V4 countries** (i.e. an organizer + min. 2 partners)
- securing at least **30% of project budget** from other sources (financial or in-kind contributions)

How to apply? (Part 1)

- Do you have a V4-related idea?
 - nearly every idea can be realized
 - consider the type of program for applying
 - the more joint activities, the better
- Do you have partners in V4 countries?
 - the key condition
 - three is a must, but **involving all four countries** is highly recommended

How to apply? (Part 2)

- fill out the on-line application form
- **original declarations** from project partners (**letters of intent**) and from **other donors** (sponsors, foundations)
- copies of ID documents of the applicant and the project partners (registry print-outs, copies of passports)

General grant conditions:

- grants cover up to 70% project costs
- reimbursements in tranches with the possibility of advance payments (up to 80% of project costs)
- 5% overhead costs
- costs documented through copies of invoices and bills
- separate **bank account** for the purposes of the grant project
- **project website** (with unique URL)
- updating press releases and the calendar of events for every project event

Non-refundable project costs:

- Capital Investments

 (acquiring equipment for the projects)
- Own Indirect Costs (utilities, telephone bills, etc.)
- Internal Costs and Expences (with the exception of up to 5% overhead costs)
- Employments Ruled by the Labor Code (including all other related costs, e.g. *per diems*, *social funds*, etc.)

Refundable project costs:

- Printing and publishing costs
- Rent of premises and related technical services
- Fees for experts, fees for artists
- Accommodation and board
- Transport costs
- Translation, interpretation costs
- Awards and prizes
- Office supplies and promotional material
- Advertising costs
- Website design and update, etc.

Frequently made mistakes:

- copies of the letters of intent (original documents necessary)
- **Wrong ID documents** (official registries of the statistical offices, district courts or interior ministries are eligible—simple copies are enough)
- unclear V4 feature (missing "Visegrad added value")
- unclear role of project partners
- dates of project events too close to the announcement of the grant selection results
- absence of proper acknowledgement of the Fund's support (missing logo, website links, etc.)

Small Grants

• 2011 Budget: **€540,000**

• Deadlines: 1 March, 1 June,

1 September, 1 December

- Contractual period: 6 months
- Supported amounts: up to €5,000
- Approval period: up to 40 working days (the project cannot start sooner)

Standard Grants

• 2011 Budget: **€2,200,000**

Deadlines: 15 March, 15 September

- Contractual period: 12 months
- Supported amounts: more than €5,001
 (on average ca. €9,000–10,000 per project)
- Approval period: up to 50 working days (the project cannot start sooner)

Visegrad Strategic Program

- 2011 Budget: **€400,000**
- Deadline: 16 May
- Cooperation of all V4 countries
- Contractual period: 12–36 months
- Supported amounts unlimited (on average ca. €30,000 per project)
- Approval period: up to 50 working days (the project cannot start sooner)




